PRESIDENTIAL OBSERVATION

The Bharatiya Janata Party was founded in April 1980. The year 2005 is the Party's Silver Jubilee Year. One of the major projects to be undertaken during this year is publication of official documents of the Party.

As a major political Party of the country, the BJP is accountable to the people, to students and scholars, and to history for providing an official account of evolution of the Party. The foot prints of evolution of the Party may be seen in these documents, which would also reflect the country's developing political, economic and social scenario.

A Committee has been set up to implement this Party Documents Project. Though the Silver Jubilee volumes will focus mainly on the BJP days, an attempt would simultaneously be made to update the Jana Sangh documents, and also include the post-emergency Janata Party phase so as to maintain the continuum.
